## How to "Fix" a Rejected Vote By Mail Ballot

Take the following steps before 4:30 pm on Friday January 8, 2021 to make your ballot count if:

- 1. (1) you were issued a provisional absentee ballot
- 2. (2) your absentee ballot was rejected there was an issue with your signature, or
- 3. (3) you did not provide an ID when you registered to vote


## Step 1: Locate one of the following forms of ID

- Georgia Driver's License (can be expired)
- Valid Photo ID card issued by an entity of the state of Georgia, any other state, or the U.S.
- Valid U.S. Passport
- Valid government employee photo ID
- Valid U.S. military ID card with photo
- Valid Tribal ID with photo
- Current utility bill showing name and address
- Current government check or paycheck showing name and address
- Current government document showing name and address
- Current bank statement showing name and address

<u>Step 2: Complete the Appropriate Affidavit</u>\*\*This step is only required if you have a provisional absentee ballot or your ballot was rejected due to an issue with your signature\*\*

You do not need to wait for your county to send you an affidavit by mail! You can access a <u>Provisional Absentee Ballot Affidavit here</u> and a <u>Ballot Signature Cure Affidavit here</u>. Both are available on the Democratic Party of Georgia's website.

Sign and print your name. Add the date.



Step 3: Submit the ID and Affidavit (if applicable) to your county registrar

The ID and affidavit can be delivered personally by the voter or a third person, or you can send a copy (can be photographs of your ID and signed affidavit) by mail, email, or fax to your county. Find the <u>contact information for your county here</u> - and make your vote count today!
